



Communal farmers benefit from predation training

During February, predation specialist Niël Viljoen presented two courses in Matatiele and Lady Frere, where nearly 100 communal farmers gained insight into the Livestock and Predation Management programme.

In Matatiele, Viljoen was assisted by NWGA production advisor Lusanda Nteta. The 53 farmers took much interest in the slides, specifically on jackal and caracal, as these two species of predators were most likely to threaten their livestock. The presentation was focused on small stock management and the farmers were happy to gain the necessary knowledge and some skills to manage predation in their communities.



In Suid-Afrika is die totale grondgebruik vir kommersiële landbou ongeveer 46,4 miljoen hektaar, wat 37,9% van die totale grondoppervlakte van ons land be-



slaan. 'n Oppervlakte van 136 214 hektaar (27 plase) van die 46,4 miljoen hektaar is spesifiek geïdentifiseer om die evaluering en toetsing van metodes te verteenwoordig. Die doel is om aanpasbare bestuurstrategieë te identifiseer, wat volhoubaar en werkbaar vir die unieke Suid-Afrikaanse boerderytoestande is.

Die monitorplase verteenwoordig gebiede met verskillende reënval, plantegroei en ekosisteme. Dit vorm 'n wye verteenwoordigende platform vir die inisiëring en eksperimentering met volhoubare bestuurstrategieë vir die vee- sowel as die wildbedryf.
